

 - The Mac must have the latest version of OS X; must also have the latest versions of iPhoto, iMovie, GarageBand, Pages, and Keynote, downloaded from the Mac App Store
 - The iPad must be an activated first- or second-generation iPad or newer, with
 the latest version of iOS; must also have the latest versions of the following apps,
 downloaded from the App Store: iBooks and iTunes U, and iOS versions of Pages,
 Keynote, iMovie, and iPhoto
 - Basic computer skills, including Internet navigation and simple word processing
 - Working knowledge of specified Mac and iPad apps
